





Coronavirus World Map: Tracking the Global Outbreak Updated May 2, 2021




Day with reporting anomaly. 14-day change trends use 7-day averages.

Doses administered per 100 people




New hospitalizations


Purpose: Measure burden of severe COVID-19 cases.










Vaccinations in Maine



Final Dose by Age Group




Post Acute Sequelae of SARS-CoV-2 (PASC)

- Long COVID
- Long Haulers Syndrome
- Post-COVID Syndrome
- Long Term COVID
- Clinical Manifestations: breathing issues, heart problems, kidney damage, loss or distortion of taste and smell, neurologic problems, mental health issues, diabetes
- Prevention: The best way to avoid post-COVID-19 complications is to prevent
 infection with the coronavirus in the first place. Practicing <u>coronavirus precautions</u> and
 getting a <u>COVID-19 vaccine</u> as soon as it is available to you are effective ways to avoid
 getting COVID-19.

The Pandemic is Almost Over, Right?

- Worldwide cases and deaths per day are increasing
- New variants with unfavorable characteristics are emerging across the globe
- Vaccination rates are variable across countries and continents
- Maine hospitalizations are increasing modestly
- Herd Immunity may occur at 70-85% vaccination rate
- Maine is best in class for vaccination rate at approximately 40%
- Prevention is an important tool
- Achieving herd immunity is the global strategy, one person at a time
